Violist **Jacob Shin**, 18, is a senior at Riverdale Country School and studies with Patinka Kopec at Manhattan School of Music Precollege. A winner of the 2014-2015 MSM Precollege Chamber Music Competition and runner-up in the 2015-2016 MSM Precollege Concerto Competition, Jacob has been a past recipient of both the Dianne Danese Flagello Scholarship and Carl Owen Memorial Scholarship for several years. During his summers, Jacob has attended the National Arts Centre Young Artists Program in Ottawa, Indiana University's Summer String Academy, and Greenwood Music Camp. In fall of 2019, Jacob was a recipient of the Patinka Kopec Precollege Violin Scholarship, placing third in that year's Philharmonic Strings Concerto Competition and participating in the Heifetz International Music Institute. Most recently, he was selected to appear on NPR's *From the Top* as its first Jack Kent Cooke Young Artist Award recipient of the Class of 2021.

At Riverdale, Jacob is a teaching assistant and principal violist of the high school orchestra, one-half of a chamber duo with a classical guitarist, and co-founder and leader of Flume, a student-run music ensemble performing both classical and contemporary repertoire for wide-ranging audiences. This past May, amidst the COVID-19 outbreak, Flume created the #BacktheBronx Project virtual concert series in partnership with Part of the Solution, a Bronx-based nonprofit, raising over \$17,000 through their GoFundMe campaign.

Jacob is proud and honored to be a recipient of the Carl Owen Memorial Scholarship this year.



At 17-years-old, Ukrainian-American pianist, **Emiliya Lytvynova Mullerman**, is already a winner of numerous competitions and awards. She has earned the first place in the XII International Performing Arts Competition for Children and Youth, "The Accords of Chortitza" in Ukraine, first place in "Aivazovsky's Guests" Music Festival in Crimea, first place in XLVII Annual "Virtuosi Per Musica di Pianoforte" in Czech Republic, second place in the XX International Music Festival of Ukraine in Kharkov, third place in Piano School of NYC Youth Piano Competition and Second Prize in the Vivo International Music Competition. She has also participated in the Citizens Committee for New York City Gala and other festivals within the New York City Russian Community. During the 2018-2019 academic year at Manhattan School of Music Precollege, Emiliya received the prestigious Constance Keene Precollege Piano Scholarship. In the 2019-2020 academic year, she was honored to receive the Rosetta Goodkind Scholarship. Currently, in 2020-2021, Emiliya is very thankful to have been chosen as a recipient of the Carl Owen Memorial Scholarship.

Emiliya is the daughter of Vadim Mullerman, one the most distinguished musicians in the former Soviet Union. Emiliya was introduced to music early in her life and, at the age of five, entered a specialized school in Kharkov, Ukraine. After her family moved to the United States in 2015, she continued her studies at the Precollege Division of Manhattan School of Music under the tutelage of Tatiana Goncharova. Emiliya currently attends Fiorello H. LaGuardia High School of Music & Art and Performing Arts. In December 2019, she performed in LaGuardia's Annual Musical Rogers and Hammerstein's *Cinderella*. At Manhattan School of Music, Emiliya loves being surrounded by talented students and distinguished faculty who share her interest in and passion for music.
