Janine Morita Colletti, Director

Janine Morita Colletti is a versatile stage director and performer, known for her work in both classical music and theatre. She has directed productions at Manhattan School of Music, Montclair State University, and Arizona State University, and has served on the directing staffs of The Dallas Opera, Des Moines Metro Opera, The Atlanta Opera, and Houston Grand Opera, where she will serve as an associate director in 2026.

As a performer, Janine has appeared with Arizona Theatre Company, Prospect Theatre Company, Arizona Opera, and Southwest Shakespeare Company, in addition to various film and television projects.

She holds a Bachelor's degree in Vocal Performance from Ithaca College and a Master's degree in Opera and Musical Theatre Performance from Arizona State University. As a biracial, multi-genre artist, Janine brings a collaborative and story-driven perspective to her work, believing that great storytelling transcends disciplines and empowers performers to become fully embodied artists.

Joel Harder, Vocal Coach-Pianist

Acclaimed Canadian pianist Joel Harder is a sought-after collaborative partner, vocal coach, chamber musician and pedagogue. He has performed nationally and internationally, and featured on WQXR Radio and Medici TV. As an opera pianist, Mr. Harder has worked at Festivals and Houses in France, Canada, and the US, under conductors including James Conlon, Lorin Maazel, and Christoph von Dohnanyi. He is also known for his insightful and sensitive interpretations of Art Song; since 2018, he has been on the artistic roster of the Brooklyn Art Song Society (BASS). Mr. Harder received his Doctor of Musical Arts degree in collaborative piano from The Juilliard School, and is currently artistic staff at Manhattan School of Music, and head opera coach at the Mason Gross School of the Arts at Rutgers University.

Chun-Wei Kang, Vocal Coach-Pianist

Chun-Wei Kang has performed in concerts both as a soloist and ensemble performer throughout the United States, Canada, and East Asia. She has appeared on *PBS Sunday Arts* in a showcase for rising young opera singers. She has won several awards and scholarships, including the Gwendolyn Koldofsky Memorial Award for "a musician who demonstrated outstanding professionalism in collaborative piano." Ms. Kang has served as staff pianist/coach in the National Music Competition in Taiwan, the Canadian

Provincial Festival, the Centro Studi Italiani Opera Festival, the Summer Opera Program in Tel Aviv, and the International Vocal Arts Institute (New York, Virginia, Puerto Rico, and Montreal). She is currently a faculty member at OperaWorks and BridgeMusik. At MSM, Chun-Wei Kang was the Music Director for the Junior Opera Theatre directed by Catherine Malfitano from 2019 to 2022. She also served as Music Director for the Opera Role Preparation Workshop directed by Mignon Dunn from 2010 to 2017, and as Assistant Music Director for *The Tailor of Gloucester*. In addition, she was instrumental in starting two summer music programs in Taiwan and Singapore and served as both artistic director and faculty member from 2016 to 2019.

Jinhee Park, Vocal Coach-Pianist

Pianist and conductor Jinhee Park (PS '19 AD '20) is recognized for her versatility across vocal and instrumental repertoire. With soprano Meredith Wohlgemuth, she won first prizes at the Schubert International LiedDuo 2023 in Dortmund and the Concours International Musical de Montréal 2022 (Art Song Division), also receiving best pianist awards at both competitions.

As a chamber musician, she has served as official pianist for the Concours International Musical de Montréal (Violin, 2023) and the Hudson Valley String Competition, and performs internationally with artists including Stella Chen and Timothy Chooi.

As a conductor, she has worked with the NOI+ Festival Orchestra, Lüneburg Symphoniker, Saratoga Orchestra of Whidbey Island, Wintergarden Festival Ensemble, and a residency with the Escuela Superior de Música y Danza de Monterrey and OAcademy Orchestra Institute in Mexico.

Jinhee holds Master's and Doctorate degrees from The Juilliard School, following studies at Manhattan School of Music and Seoul National University.

Manuel Arellano, Spanish Diction Coach

Pianist/coach Manuel Arellano recently graduated from the Domingo-Colburn-Stein Young Artist program at LA Opera. After completing a master's degree in collaborative piano with Martin Katz, he freelanced for a year in Berlin. In 2022, he a concluded a doctorate in opera coaching with Tamar Sanikidze at the University of Texas.

Manuel has worked on Carolina Performing Arts' production of Omar and at the Butler Opera International Festival, and has accompanied renowned soprano, Julia Migenes, in concert, as well as Stevie Wonder, and just made his Lincoln Center debut with Key'mon Murrah. He was also a fellow at Wolf Trap Opera, Music Academy of the West, Aspen Opera Theater, and staff at Chautauqua Opera Conservatory.

Cynthia Gray, Production Stage Manager

Cynthia Gray (ze/hir) is an award-winning actor and writer. Hir writing has been published in *Burnt Pine* Magazine, *The Wire Dream Magazine*, and the *Strand Zine*, and hir films have been screened at festivals around the world. Hir short stage play *The Postman's Letter* was produced as part of the Midtown International Theatre Festival. Hir previous stage work includes *An Ideal Husband*, *Avenue* 2, *Les Misérables*, and more. Gray has also appeared in various films, TV shows, commercials, and more.

OPERA AT MANHATTAN SCHOOL OF MUSIC

Manhattan School of Music opera productions have been praised as a significant contribution to operatic life in New York City, and numerous performances have been released as commercial recordings. Opera is a significant feature of the vocal performance experience at MSM. All voice students participate in ensembles, and opera experience is available through a rich variety of opera related programs and courses.

Graduate students develop their artistry under the guidance of eminent artist teachers, while gaining exposure before New York City audiences through the many performance opportunities MSM offers. Productions each year include two full operas with orchestra on the Neidorff-Karpati stage; a new fall opera scenes series; a new fall chamber opera-level production; a fall Opera Workshop to hone audition and professional skills; a new spring Opera in Concert collaboration with the MSM Symphony Orchestra; a workshop of a new work or a workshop performance of a one-act opera; and a Musical Theatre Lab.

Juniors and seniors participate in a fall opera scenes program that explores a wide variety of styles and languages while developing important artistic and collaborative skills. In the spring, they audition to appear in a fully staged production with chamber orchestra, or in a one-act opera or cabaret-style performance with piano.
