DIRECTOR'S NOTE


Kurt Weill's *The Seven Deadly Sins* has always struck me as both ferociously political and heartbreakingly human. On the surface, it's Brecht's sharp critique of capitalism—where the traditional "sins" become twisted into virtues, and success demands the betrayal of one's moral compass. But it's also a story about a woman who slowly loses her sense of self as she tries to live up to impossible standards and the relentless pressure to earn, achieve, and behave.

For me, the tension between these two layers—the political and the personal—is the core of this piece. It also happens to be the last collaboration between Brecht and Weill, as their artistic goals slowly veered away from one another.

Brecht and Weill wrote *The Seven Deadly Sins* while in exile, escaping a rising regime that was weaponizing fear, nationalism, and greed. I'm drawn to that moment in history—and to its echoes in our own time. In this production, the story exists in different eras rather than living in a single setting, to highlight just how persistent these forces are. However, some moments feel distinctly modern, because I believe the warnings Brecht and Weill sounded nearly a century ago still apply today.

At its core, this opera is about what it means to survive as a human in this world; it's about the cost of success and the slow erosion of the self under pressure. Anna's story isn't just a fable of morality; it's a mirror. It asks us to look at the ways we compromise, adapt, and sometimes fracture, just to make it through.

CREATIVE TEAM

Becca Jo Loeb, Director

Rebecca Jo Loeb, lyric mezzo-soprano and director, has performed with leading opera houses and festivals worldwide.

As a director, she has led *La Calisto* at Montclair State University, *The Magic Flute* and *Hänsel und Gretel* in Kandersteg, Switzerland, *Le Nozze di Figaro* and *The Crucible* at Berlin Opera Academy, and a concert of Rodgers and Guettel at The Juilliard School. She has also taught masterclasses at Brown University, and Arizona State University.

Recent performing highlights include Written on Skin in Stavanger, Greek at Deutsche Oper Berlin, the world premiere of Omar at the Spoleto Festival, and covering Fyodor in Boris Godunov at the Metropolitan Opera. A former ensemble member of Deutsche Oper Berlin and Hamburgische Staatsoper, she performed signature roles such as Cherubino, Rosina, Hänsel, and Orlofsky. Other notable credits include the Metropolitan Opera (Flora), Oper Köln (The Fox), Festival d'Aix-en-Provence (Angel 2/Marie), Teatro Municipal São Paulo (p r i s m), Glimmerglass Opera, LA Opera, and the Tanglewood Music Center.

Loeb is a champion of contemporary works, premiering lead roles in Pulitzer Prize-winning operas *prism* and *Omar*. She is a graduate of Juilliard, Manhattan School of Music, and the University of Michigan, and a winner of the Lotte Lenya Competition First Prize.

Felicity Stiverson, Choreographer

Felicity Stiverson's work as a director/choreographer includes recent productions of Princess Ida: The Glow Up (Manhattan School of Music), The Fairy Queen (MSM), and Hansel and Gretel (Opera San Antonio and New Orleans Opera). Her work as a choreographer includes The Anonymous Lover (Opera Philadelphia), Waitress (Engeman Theater), The Cunning Little Vixen (MSM), Susannah (Wolf Trap Opera), West Side Story (Weston Playhouse), Orpheus in the Underworld (MSM), White Christmas (Weston Playhouse), Buddy (Cape Playhouse), Pippin (Weston Playhouse), Singin' in the Rain (Weston Playhouse), Turandot (New Orleans Opera), The Barber of Seville (Opera San Antonio), Music City Christmas (Nashville Symphony), Hair (Weston Playhouse), Sense and Sensibility (Everyman Theater), Jekyll and Hyde (WPPAC), and Tenderly (Weston Playhouse).

Performing credits include the musical Hot Feet on Broadway, national and international tours of West Side Story, Grease, Steel Pier, Candide, and My Fair Lady,

and numerous regional theater and opera productions. Felicity has danced on *Boardwalk Empire*, the Today Show, and 30 Rock. She graduated magna cum laude with a degree in English literature from Barnard College, Columbia University. She is currently on the dance faculty of Manhattan School of Music. Djordje Stevan Nesic, Conductor and Vocal Coach-Pianist

Djordje Stevan Nesic's performances have been described as artful, assertive, sensitive and quietly virtuosic, and his career highlighted by recital, concerto, chamber, and collaborative performances, both in the U.S. and internationally. He strives to promote music addressing contemporary, social justice, and human rights issues.

This season at MSM, Djordje leads and conducts the production of Kurt Weill and Bertold Brecht's *Seven Deadly Sins*. Recently, he conducted the productions of Handel's *Alcina* at the Opera Seme Festival in Arezzo, Italy; at MSM: Jack Perla and Jessica Murphy Moo's *An American Dream*, Mozart's *La finta giardiniera*, Ullmann/Kien's *Der Kaiser von Atlantis*, as well as Ana Sokolovic's *Svadba* at both MSM and the Peabody Conservatory. Other recent engagements include: a world premiere of *She Who Dared* by Jasmine Barnes and Deborah D.E.E.P. Mouton with ALT, recitals in Belgrade, Serbia, and a return to Opera Saratoga. He appeared with the Berkshire Opera Festival, Carnegie Hall Joyce DiDonato masterclasses in NYC, Kolarac Hall in Belgrade, the Prototype Festival in NYC, the KotorArt Festival in Montenegro, the Serbian Cultural Center in Paris, and the Caixa Cultural in Brasilia. With a group of his students from Carnegie Mellon University, he presented the staged premiere of the opera Svadba by Ana Sokolovic.

Recordings include Marc Blitzstein's *The Cradle Will Rock* on Bridge Records, Ricky Ian Gordon's *Ellen West* on Bright Shiny Things, and *Opera America Songbook*. Other venues include Lincoln Center, the United Nations General Assembly Hall, the Mann Performing Arts Center in Philadelphia, FUJI TV in Japan, the Aspen Music Festival, Tanglewood Festival, Glimmerglass Opera, Houston Grand Opera, the Greenwich Music Festival, and the Phoenicia Voice Festival.

He is a citizen of both the U.S.A. and Serbia. Formerly a faculty member of Carnegie Mellon University School of Music, he currently teaches at Manhattan School of Music and SUNY Purchase Music Conservatory.

OPERA AT MANHATTAN SCHOOL OF MUSIC

Manhattan School of Music opera productions have been praised as a significant contribution to operatic life in New York City, and numerous performances have been released as commercial recordings. Opera is a significant feature of the vocal performance experience at MSM. All voice students participate in ensembles, and opera experience is available through a rich variety of opera related programs and courses.

Graduate students develop their artistry under the guidance of eminent artist teachers, while gaining exposure before New York City audiences through the many performance opportunities MSM offers. Productions each year include two full operas with orchestra on the Neidorff-Karpati stage; a new fall opera scenes series; a new fall chamber opera-level production; a fall Opera Workshop to hone audition and professional skills; a new spring Opera in Concert collaboration with the MSM Symphony Orchestra; a workshop of a new work or a workshop performance of a one-act opera; and a Musical Theatre Lab.

Juniors and seniors participate in a fall opera scenes program that explores a wide variety of styles and languages while developing important artistic and collaborative skills. In the spring, they audition to appear in a fully staged production with chamber orchestra, or in a one-act opera or cabaret-style performance with piano.
