ABOUT THE ARTISTS

Tanatchaya Chanphanitpornkit, Conductor

Tanatchaya (Tanya) Chanphanitpornkit, known for her joy, is a double bassist and conductor from Thailand focused on educating and inspiring young musicians. Chanphanitpornkit received her education from the Eastman School of Music. She continued her education at Teachers College, Columbia University, where the emphasis of her Master of Arts and Master of Education degrees was on social justice through orchestral pedagogy and her pedagogy was highlighted in an exhibit for the Smith Learning Theater. Currently, Chanphanitpornkit is continuing her studies as a doctoral candidate at Teachers College studying first-generation college students in music conservatory.

Chanphanitpornkit currently teaches at LaGuardia High School. She is the Music Director of New York Youth Symphony's Crescendo Orchestra and conductor of Manhattan School of Music Precollege Symphony Orchestra and Concert Orchestra. Her higher education positions include Teachers College, Columbia University, Brooklyn College, William Paterson University, and The College of New Jersey. She is a co-founder of the nonprofit Girls Who Conduct. She has served as the Assistant Conductor for New York Youth Symphony's GRAMMY Award-winning Orchestra.

In 2025, she was named Yamaha's 40 Under 40 Music Educator and she is a quarterfinalist for the GRAMMY Music Educator Award. Previously, she was awarded the Eastman Centennial Award, where in honor of its centennial year, Eastman created the Centennial Award to recognize 100 individuals who exemplify Eastman's mission and legacy through their commitment to artistry, scholarship, leadership, community engagement, and/or philanthropy. In 2022, she was awarded the Early Career Award by Teachers College, Columbia University. As she continues on her journey in music education alongside her students, she will always base her decisions and teachings on the belief that the symphony is for everyone.

Nathan Hetherington (MM '04, MM '06), Conductor

Nathan Hetherington is active in the New York City area as a conductor, composer, teacher, and singer. He has long been a champion of new music in both the jazz and classical worlds and has conducted countless premieres, working closely with composers to bring their works to life with energy and sensitivity. Nathan is deeply engaged with the world of music education, sharing his knowledge and love of music history, music theory, composition, and conducting with students of all ages and levels of musical ability.

Nathan Hetherington's passionate commitment to the training of young orchestral musicians led him to create the Praxis Youth Leadership Orchestra, a radically new type of ensemble focused on mentoring serious young musicians in musical and social leadership. In addition to his work with Praxis, he conducts at the Manhattan School of Music Precollege Division and Summer Music Camp, as well as the Lucy Moses and Special Music Schools. In 2012 he was appointed Orchestra Director at Horace Mann School, where, in addition to his conducting duties in the Middle and Upper Divisions, he teaches music history and steel drums.

Nathan received his B.A. in music from Vassar College, where he founded and for two years directed the Mahagonny Ensemble, a student group of singers and instrumentalists specializing in concert and theater works of the last 100 years. Following a year of conducting study with Tonu Kalam at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, Nathan completed an M.M. in jazz vocal performance at Manhattan School of Music. In May 2006, he completed a second master's degree at MSM in classical composition, studying with J. Mark Stambaugh. After graduating, he continued his compositional studies privately with Richard Danielpour and his conducting studies with Roger Nierenberg.

Matthew Tsang, piano

Matthew Tsang began piano studies at the age of seven and currently attends the Precollege Division at Manhattan School of Music, where he studies with Dr. Daniela Bracchi. His earlier training includes work with Dr. Hoi-Young Jang.

Matthew has performed at major New York venues including Merkin Hall, Weill Recital Hall at Carnegie Hall, and multiple stages across the region through competitions, recitals, and school events. He has been a top prize winner in the VIVO International Music Competition, the Elite International Music Competition, and other youth performance events.

He has participated in summer programs at the Peabody Conservatory, studying with Professor Alexander Shtarkman, and has taken part in master classes with Dr. Michael Angelucci, Mr. Meng-Chieh Liu, and Dr. Min Kwon. Matthew has also performed at various community concerts, senior-residence recital series, and school music festivals.

Before focusing fully on piano, Matthew participated in violin and orchestral programs in elementary school, earning selections to All-County and the Long Island String Festival Association (LISFA). He continued performing in the Syosset middle school and high school orchestras, gaining additional ensemble experience.

Matthew is currently a member of the Tsang Brothers Piano Duo (Matthew and

Marcus Tsang), performing collaborative works for four hands and two pianos. He also serves as a church pianist in an Episcopal parish, contributing regularly to community musical life.

He draws inspiration from many leading classical artists, including Lang Lang.

Yuqing Li, violin

Yuqing Li is a sixteen-year-old violinist currently studying with Prof. Lucie Robert in the Precollege Division at Manhattan School of Music.

Born in China, Li began violin at the age of four. She won first place in the preliminaries of the 2019 Hong Kong International Violin Competition and later received an award from the Singapore International Violin Online Competition. In 2022, Li was awarded the Kate Bamberger Memorial Scholarship to attend MSM.

In 2023, Li performed Lalo's *Symphonie Espagnole* with the Greenwich Symphony Orchestra, received Honorable Mention in the MSM Precollege Philharmonic Concerto Competition, and won the NYIMF Competition Division. She also earned a Nana's Way Scholarship for the 2023–2024 year.

In 2024, Li won Second Prize in the Anselmo VI International Music Competition and First Prize in the 2024 New York Laureate International Music Competition. She was a finalist in the 2025 Jefferson Symphony Orchestra Young Artist Competition and won First Prize in the MSM Precollege 2024–2025 Philharmonic Concerto Competition. She was honored to receive the Kate Bamberger Memorial Scholarship again in 2024–2025, as well as the Chloé Kiffer Scholarship for 2025–2026.

Li also studied at the Professional Children's School of New York, receiving the school's highest international student scholarship for three consecutive years. She is passionate about writing and hope to share their music widely in the future.

Manhattan School of Music's Precollege Division is a Saturday music program for students aged 8 to 18, accepted by audition. In either the Classical or Jazz program, students participate in an enriching curriculum that includes private lessons, classes in music theory and ear training, and participation in the Precollege orchestras, choruses, operas, musical theatre productions, or jazz ensembles. A wide variety of elective classes in chamber music, music history, conducting, composition, and more are also available. With an emphasis on performance, numerous student recitals, studio classes, and master classes take place throughout the year, as well as annual concerto and chamber music competitions.
